RN-TO-BSN PROGRAM

The BSN completion program is designed to take advantage of excellent courses already offered at Wilson College. Liberal arts coursework is specifically selected on the basis of relevancy to nurses, providing a thoughtful, interdisciplinary approach to the education of nurses.

Designed to be completed in as little as 18 months, the RN-to-BSN program offers 34 credits for your valid nursing license and an additional 27 to 48 credits for coursework completed as part of your pre-licensure studies. In keeping with national standards, you will complete 38 to 59 semester hours at Wilson, for a total of 120 semester hours.

RN-to-BSN Admission Requirements

- A valid nursing license.
- A diploma or associate degree in nursing from an accredited college or university.
- GPA of at least 2.7.
- Official transcripts from all previous college work
- Admission conference with program director or nursing faculty.

RN-TO-MSN PROGRAM

The RN-to-MSN program at Wilson is designed to facilitate academic progression to higher levels of education. In this program, you would complete a bridge year of classes designed to help prepare you for graduate studies. With successful completion of the bridge year, you are admitted to the MSN program. Note, this program does not provide students with a bachelor's degree.

RN-to-MSN Admission Requirements

- Active RN license in the state in which you practice.
- A diploma or associate degree in nursing from an accredited college or university.
- Interview with the program director.
- GPA of 3.0 (a lower GPA may be accepted with interview and conditions at the discretion of the program director).
- Resume or CV.
- The RN-to-MSN option requires a minimum of three years of nursing experience or a bachelor's degree in any major.



MSN PROGRAM

The MSN degree program is a total of 38 semester hours. The program may be completed in 18 months full time or 2.5 years on a part-time basis.

Leadership Track: Today, an advanced degree is necessary for nurses who manage complex multi-disciplinary teams. Nurse leaders must have an understanding of administrative theory and application to practice in multiple areas, including budget and personnel management, quality and safety control and transformational leadership.

Wilson's MSN in nursing leadership provides the tools and learning experiences needed to excel as a nurse administrator in today's healthcare system.

Education Track: Many colleges of nursing do not have the faculty to meet the demand of qualified applicants. This lack of adequately prepared faculty is a substantial element of the nursing shortage that is expected to increase. The MSN in nursing education at Wilson will prepare you to excel as a faculty member, staff educator or community and patient educator.

MSN Admission Requirements

- The MSN education track requires a bachelor's degree in nursing.
- The MSN nursing management track requires an RN license and a bachelor's degree in any major.
- Active RN license in the state in which you practice.
- Interview with the program director.
- GPA of 3.0 (a lower GPA may be accepted with interview and conditions at the discretion of the program director).
- Resume or CV.
