## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Students must satisfactorily complete 10 courses to earn the Master of Healthcare Management for Sustainability degree.

The following six courses are required for all students:

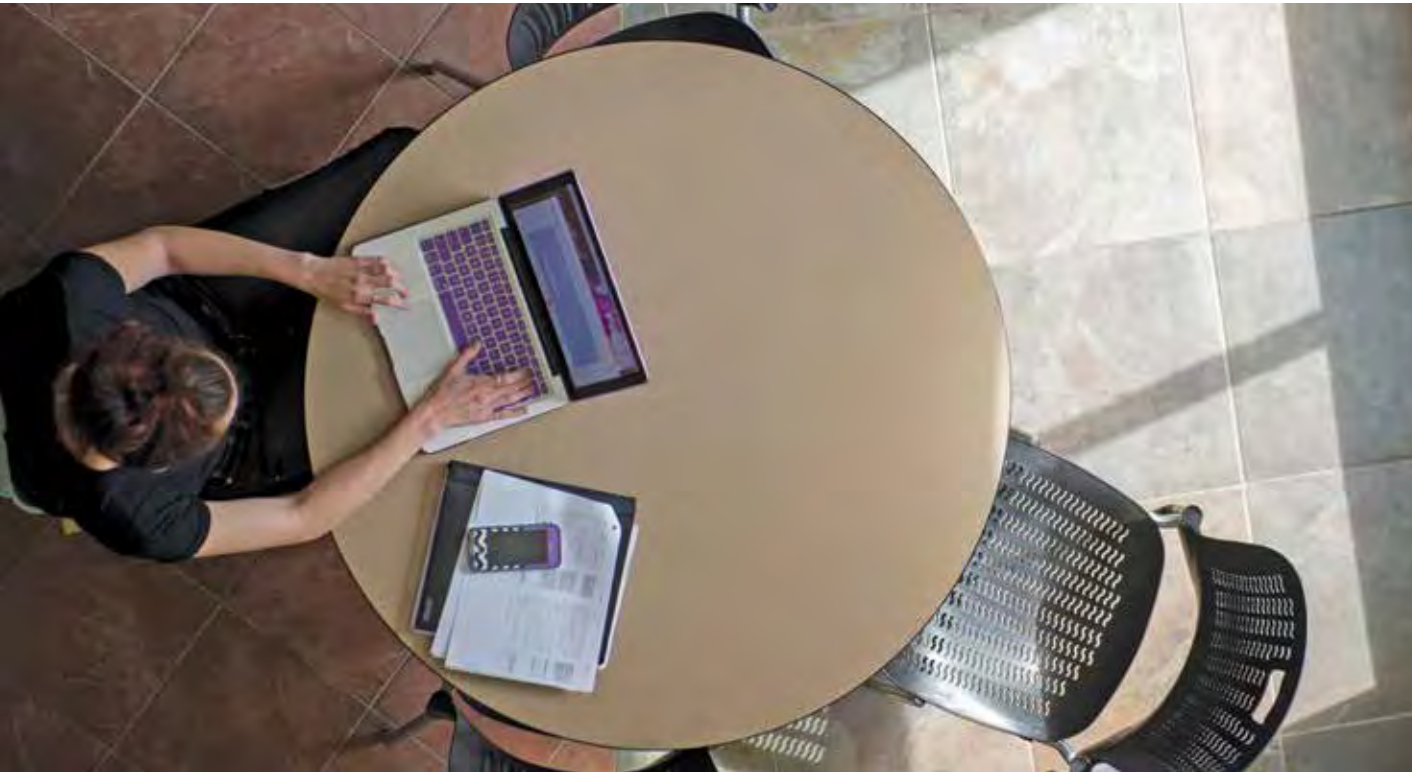
- The History of Healthcare Reform in the United States and Universal Healthcare Models
- The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010
- Innovative Management Models
- Healthcare Economics
- Legal Issues in Healthcare
- Process Reengineering

Students must complete four elective courses from a growing list of more than 30 electives, including:

- Advanced Accounting
- Data Mining

- Enterprise Risk Management
- Executive Leadership
- Interpersonal Dynamic and Covert Behavior
- The Political Process: Communications and the Management of Regulatory Change in Healthcare

## PROGRAM ADMISSION

Admission to the Master of Healthcare Management for Sustainability program is based on the following criteria:

- **Completion of a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education.**
- **A completed application and resume.**
- **Official transcripts from all colleges and/or universities attended.**
- **Two letters of recommendation from educators or employers.**
